

CLOSURE DAYS / STUDENT FREE DAYS POLICY

All Trinity College Colac Policies will be read and developed with reference to the Core Values, Vision and Mission of the College as well as any other relevant College policies.

RATIONALE

To facilitate the professional learning of staff, opportunities are to be provided for staff of a school to come together for professional learning, planning and evaluation days.

SCRIPTURAL CONTEXT

POLICY

At Trinity College Colac, student free days will be held during the year to allow staff to attend appropriate professional learning as a whole group.

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Schools are encouraged to allocate one of the four
student-free days for Religious Education or religious
formation.
In addition to the four designated professional learning
days, additional student-free days may occur for such
activities as Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews and
School Planning Days. Parents will be notified via the
College Calendar.
School terms are to correspond with those notified and
published by the Department of Education and Early
Childhood Development in the Education Gazette.
When possible, the College will notify parents of
proposed dates for student-free days / school closure
days and school holidays, at the beginning of each
school year.
