



CLOSURE DAYS / STUDENT FREE DAYS POLICY

All Trinity College Colac Policies will be read and developed with reference to the Core Values, Vision and Mission of the College as well as any other relevant College policies.

RATIONALE

To facilitate the professional learning of staff, opportunities are to be provided for staff of a school to come together for professional learning, planning and evaluation days.

SCRIPTURAL CONTEXT

'Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom.'

POLICY

At Trinity College Colac, student free days will be held during the year to allow staff to attend appropriate professional learning as a whole group.

POLICY GUIDELINES	GUIDELINE INDICATORS
<p>School closure days are planned school holidays with the permission of the appropriate Governing Authority.</p> <p>Student-free days are days when students do not attend school and when staff are involved in planned educational activities.</p> <p>School holidays are those notified and published by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development in the Education Gazette.</p>	<p>In determining school closure days, the organisation of the local community is to be taken into account (such as buses, local Department of Education and Early Childhood Development school closure days, community holidays)</p> <p>School closure days will normally be designated public holidays; however, there is scope, at the discretion of the Governing Authority, to approve school closure days at other times.</p> <p>The first two days and the last days of the school year will usually be student-free days.</p> <p>Four additional days during the school year may be allocated by the Principal and staff as student-free. The College Board should be notified of such days.</p> <p>Suitable professional learning activities will be organised by the Principal, or the Principal's delegate, for student-free days.</p> <p>Such professional learning will be a part of the planning and resource allocation proposed for the year.</p>

	<p>Schools are encouraged to allocate one of the four student-free days for Religious Education or religious formation.</p> <p>In addition to the four designated professional learning days, additional student-free days may occur for such activities as Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews and School Planning Days. Parents will be notified via the College Calendar.</p> <p>School terms are to correspond with those notified and published by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development in the Education Gazette.</p> <p>When possible, the College will notify parents of proposed dates for student-free days / school closure days and school holidays, at the beginning of each school year.</p>
